Docs push for taking swift action to cure snakebite hit

Lucknow: Era's Lucknow Medical College and Hospital, in collaboration with the Society of Acute Care Trauma and Emergency Medicine, observed World Emergency Medicine Day on Tuesday with a special focus on managing poisoning cases, particularly snakebites, ahead of the monsoon.

Dr Mustahsin Malik, organising chairman and head of critical care medicine, stressed the urgency of swift action at the event. "Avoid panic, tourniquets or suction. Stabilise the limb and rush the patient to hospital," advised Dr Malik.

Dr Madhulika emphasised that ASV dosage remains the same for children and pregnant women. Prof Jeevan Prakash highlighted the importance of the "golden hour" in saving lives. Dr (Brig) Sujit Basu and Dr Rizwan Khan shared evidence-based practices.
