Tetanus-afflicted farmer saved with timely aid

Lucknow: Doctors at a private medical college successfully treated a 40-year-old farmer who developed severe tetanus after stepping on a rusty nail while working in his field. Tetanus cases are now rare due to vaccination, but once contracted, the disease can be fatal.

Rajesh Kumar of Sitapur was brought to **Era Medical College** in a critical condition on June 16. His jaw was locked, his muscles were stiff and he lost voluntary control of his body.

Dr Mustahsin Malik, head of critical care medicine, said Rajesh was suffering from respiratory paralysis—a life-threatening complication of tetanus. He was immediately shifted to the ICU, where he underwent three weeks of intensive care before making a full recovery.

Doctors said tetanus bacteria found in soil can enter deep wounds and cause fatal complications if not treated promptly.
